TREBON

Trebon is a small town in the district Jindrichuv Hradec in South Bohemia, 22 km east of Ceske Budejovice. It is in the Trebon basin on the Zlata stoka (Golden sewer) between the ponds Svet and Rozmberk. (According to statistics ..) Over 8,500 permanent residents lived there in 2011. It is a Spa town and an urban conservation area at the centre of Trebonsko Nature Conservation Area.

The city is frequently visited by tourists and spa guests. There are two spas in the town: Berta Spa and Aurora Spa. There is the headquarters of the Rybarstvi Trebon, the biggest fishery company in Europe, and the Regent brewery, which was founded in 1379 and is one of the oldest breweries in the World. Trebon castle has the third largest area (after the Prague Castle and the Czech Krumlov) in the Czech Republic. It is a residence of the Regional State Archives with province of all the South Bohemia Region. The former Augustinian Monastery is a pearl of South Bohemian Gothic.

The landscape is protected as the Nature Conservation Area Trebonsko and a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve. Trebon city and its surroundings are suitable for relaxing, cycling and horse riding in the summer.

Weimaraners are intelligent, all-round, communicative, friendly and loyal to "human pack", which makes them a favourable breed. As well as the founders of the Czech breed many years ago, today's hunters and game keepers praise Weimaraner's remarkable hunting qualities and their diligence. With the decrease in numbers of small game, we are rediscovering their unique performance shortly after the shot is fired, when they follow the blood tracks and search for wounded or dead animals. In water they are diligent, persistent and eager helpers. Apart from that, Weimaraners show their exquisite and all-round qualities in agility, dog-treking, defending, rescue work, assistance or canis therapy.

Weimar pointers have participated.

Passing the performance test is the basic condition for the dog to be included into the breeding program. The most important tests or trials are the Autumn Club and its founder, i.e. Memorial of Robert Jakoubek. The fourth Memorial will be held this year.

Recently, our Weimaraners have appeared in the lists of the top competitions, namely Memorial of

Weimaraner enthusiasts. There are about 80 Weimaraner short-haired stud dogs and 200 bitches. There are about 400 Weimaraner puppies born every year.

Breeding of long-haired pointers is more complicated: the number of breed dogs and bitches is only about 40.

The Club of Weimaraner Breeders organizes one special show and one club show every year where it awards titles CAJC, CAC, BOS, BOB, BIS and the Club Winner. Lately, more than 100 Weimar pointers have participated.

The expansion of the Czech breed took place after the Second World War when it was supported by Doctor Jan Fiala who also brought the first longhaired Weimaraner bitch called Bessy von Burgholz. She was the founder of our first longhaired Weimaraners kennel of the Včínava banks which belonged to Mr Randa.

The Club of Weimaraner Breeders was founded on 21st December 1966.

Since then, the main aim of the club has been controlled breeding of healthy, well-balanced Weimaraners and strengthening innate hunting qualities in the breed.

The first Weimaraners were brought to Bohemia by Czech foresters in the 1920's. The forest keeper Richard Tománek from Prostějov region is considered to be the founder of our breed; his two dogs – Argo and Gerda - imported from Germany were the ones to start the first Czech breeding of Weimaraners of "the Baltic Sea."
